Abstract

Contains the papers of Clara E. Vanderbilt, director of the Physician Assistant Surgical Residency program at Montefiore Medical Center from 1978 to 2000, and the founding president of the New York State Society of Physician Assistants (NYSSPA). Types of materials include correspondence, meeting agenda books, committee materials, minutes, subject files, reports, reprints, pamphlets, photographs, and newsletters. Major subjects include New York State Society of Physician Assistants, American Academy of Physician Assistants, National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants, Association of Physician Assistant Programs, certification and recertification of physician assistants, continuing medical education, Medicare reimbursement, legislation and legal affairs, specialty physician assistant programs, and surgical assistants. Materials range in date from 1970 to 1987.

Biographical Note

Clara E. Vanderbilt was born in Hillsborough, N.C. in 1940. She graduated from the Duke University Physician Assistant Program in 1971, and Empire State College in 1982. She was one of the first two physician assistant surgical residents employed in 1971 by Montefiore Medical Center, Albert Einstein College of Medicine (AECOM). Along with Drs. Marvin Gleidman and Richard Rosen, Vanderbilt helped establish the first physician assistant surgical postgraduate program in the country. She was director of the physician assistant surgical residency program at Montefiore Medical Center from 1978 until she retired in 2000. As a member of the AECOM faculty, Ms. Vanderbilt precepted students from over 25 programs, including Duke University's program.

Ms. Vanderbilt is a founding member of the Eugene Stead, Jr. Physician Assistant Student Society, one of the first constituent chapters of the current Student Academy of the American Academy of Physician Assistants (SAAPA). She served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Physician Assistants (AAPA) from 1972 to 1975 and was the organization's vice president in 1975. She became the founding president of the New York State Society of Physician Assistants (NYSSPA) in 1975 and was elected the organization's first president in 1976. Ms. Vanderbilt has served on numerous committees of the AAPA and NYSSPA including chair of the NYSSPA's Ethics and Judicial Affairs Committee. She was one of the first PAs appointed to the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA), serving from 1977 to 1983, and was twice elected president of the Association of Postgraduate Physician Assistant Programs.

Among her many awards and certificates of appreciation, Vanderbilt was awarded the AAPA presidential award in 1983 and the 20th anniversary award in 1988. She received the distinguished alumnus award from the Duke University Physician Assistant Program in 2000. The NYSSPA presidential award banquet was named in her honor in 2000.
