Abstract

Contains the papers of Nelson E. Myers, a United States Navy Hospital Corpsman who was among the early graduates of the Duke University Physician Assistant Program. Before becoming a physician assistant, Mr. Myers was employed in the cardiovascular laboratory at the Duke University Medical Center in Durham, NC. He spent over 35 years working as a physician assistant primarily at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Muskogee Oklahoma. Types of materials include personal papers, photographs and notebooks. Materials range in date from 1962 to 2003.

Biographical/Historical Note

Nelson Earl Myers is a native of Coraopolis, Pennsylvania. He completed the Navy's Hospital Corps School at Great Lakes, Illinois in 1959 and was stationed at the Portsmouth, Virginia Naval Hospital. While there he met several former Duke Cardiologists who were establishing a cardiac catheterization laboratory at the hospital. This eventually led to his accepting a position at Duke University in the cardiovascular lab after he left the Navy in 1962. His supervising physician was Dr. Henry McIntosh who at the time was trying to help Dr. Eugene A. Stead, Jr., the chairman of the Department of Medicine, to secure clinical support personnel for the Duke University Hospital. As a member of the staff, Nelson was asked to participate in research activities, surgical interventions, cardiac catheterizations, electronic instrumentation, and patient care.

Dr. McIntosh appreciated Nelson's knowledge and skills and supported his efforts to enroll in the Duke University Physician Assistant Program when it was established by Dr. Stead within the Department of Medicine in 1965. Nelson continued working in the Cardiac Catheterization lab while attending classes and rotations which prolonged his completion of the program by a year. Upon graduation, he continued working at Duke as the Supervisor of the Myocardial Infarction Research Unit Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory, located on the Coronary Care Unit.

In 1970, Nelson went to work for Dr. Fred Ownby of Nashville, Tennessee. One year later, he accepted a position at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Muskogee Oklahoma where he spent the next thirty two years until retiring in 2003 practicing in the cardiology, oncology and internal medicine departments. He received the Administrator's Hands and Heart award in 1993. He also served as the Hospice director, Chairman of the Tumor Board, and as a member of both the Ethics and the Pharmacy and Therapeutics committees. He helped educate PA students and medical residents and received numerous awards from a variety of academic institutions. He is a Charter Member of the Oklahoma Academy of Physician Assistants (OAPA), and served on the OAPA board of directors.

Nelson was a founding member of the American Academy of Physicians Assistants established in 1968 and an inaugural member of the American Registry of Physicians' Associates founded in 1970. He was named a Distinguished Fellow of the American Academy of Physician Assistants in 2010.

Collection Overview

This collection contains papers, photographs and notebooks relating to Nelson E. Myers' career in the cardiovascular laboratory and as a student in the PA Program at Duke University and his

career as a physician assistant for over 35 years. Materials are arranged chronologically from 1962-2003.

Personal Papers

This collection contains correspondence, newsletters, clippings, manuscripts, bulletins, pamphlets and education materials related to working in a cardiovascular laboratory, being a physician assistant student and working as a physician assistant over 35 years.
